The First LessonMrs. Alexandria Cartwright

Reader : A Reading from the Word of God written in 2 Kings 4:8-37

8. One day Elisha was passing through Shunem, where a wealthy woman lived, who urged him to have a meal. So whenever he passed that way, he would stop there for a meal. 9. She said to her husband, "Look, I am sure that this man who regularly passes our way is a holy man of God. 10. Let us make a small roof chamber with walls, and put there for him a bed, a table, a chair, and a lamp, so that he can stay there whenever he comes to us." 11. One day when he came there, he went up to the chamber and lay down there. 12. He said to his servant Gehazi, "Call the Shunammite woman." When he had called her, she stood before him. 13. He said to him, "Say to her, Since you have taken all this trouble for us, what may be done for you?"

Would you have a word spoken on your behalf to the king or to the commander of the army?" She answered, "I live among my own people." 14. He said, "What then may be done for her?" Gehazi answered, "Well, she has no son, and her husband is old." 15. He said, "Call her." When he had called her, she stood at the door. 16. He said, "At this season, in due time, you shall embrace a son." She replied, "No, my lord, O man of God; do not deceive your servant." 17. The woman conceived and bore a son at that season, in due time, as Elisha had declared to her. 18. When the child was older, he went out one day to his father among the reapers. He complained to his father, "Oh, my head, my head!" The father said to his servant, "Carry him to his mother." 20. He carried him and brought him to his mother; the child sat on her lap until noon, and he died. 21. She went up and laid him on the bed of the man of God, closed the door on him, and left.

The enthronement

Throughout History the practice of enthronement has been used in state and religious settings. Enthronement is a ceremony of inauguration and of the celebration of a new ministry, built around the entrance into the Cathedral of the new bishop of the diocese and the said Bishop being seated in the chair or throne appointed to that office.

Throughout history, in almost every culture and in our human consciousness, the chair is seen as a symbol of authority, and of the power and responsibility to teach, mentor, guide and to adjudicate. Therefore, in Christianity, it has become the norm in almost every denomination that bishops have some kind of enthronement ceremony after they have assumed office.

In the earlier days of the Diocese of Nassau (and the Bahamas, Including the Turks & Caicos Islands), its Bishops were consecrated in England, sent to these Islands and enthroned at a later date some time after their consecration.

The Right Reverend Bishop Laish Boyd is the third indigenous Bishop to undergo this particular rite as the new Diocesan Bishop of this Diocese. We all acknowledge this ceremonial beginning of his new ministry, and his public acceptance of that ministry.

CLERICAL WEAR

- Crozier - The crook-shaped staff carried by bishops. It has become one of the symbols of bishops' pastoral authority, and is carried by them in procession, as well as being held by them when giving the Absolution or the Blessing.
- Mitre - The head-dress worn by bishops, and one of the symbols of their authority. It is the shape of an inverted shield, usually of embroidered satin, with two fringed lappets hanging down the back.
- Pectoral Cross - A cross, often of precious metal, worn on the breast. It is suspended by a chain which goes round the neck.
- Ring - The ring which bishops wear is a symbol of their marriage to the Church. It is worn on the third finger of the right hand, is of gold and usually contains an amethyst.
- Rochet - The long alb-like robe worn by a bishop.
- Stole - A long narrow garment, usually embroidered, hanging round the neck and down to the knees, which is worn at the Eucharist, whether by itself or in conjunction with the other Eucharistic vestments, and also when other sacraments are being administered.
- Surplice - A garment of white material, of varying length, with wide sleeves.
- Vestments - The distinctive dress worn by the clergy at the Eucharist, and at other times when officiating at services of the Church.
