Reader : A Reading from the Word of God written in Exodus 20:1-17

Then God spoke all these words: 2. I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery; 3. you shall have no other gods before me. 4. You shall not make for yourself an idol, whether in the

form of anything that is in heaven above, or that is on the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. 5. You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I the Lord your God am a jealous God, punishing children for the iniquity of parents, to the third and the fourth generation of those who reject me, 6. but showing steadfast love to the thousandth generation of those who love me and keep my commandments. 7. You shall not make wrongful use of the name of the Lord your God, for the Lord will not acquit anyone who misuses his name. 8. Remember the sabbath day, and keep it holy. 9. Six days you shall labor and do all your work. 10. But the seventh day is a sabbath to the Lord your God; you shall not do any work-- you, your son or your daughter, your male or female slave, your livestock, or the alien resident in your towns. 11. For in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but rested the seventh day; therefore the LORD blessed the sabbath day and consecrated it. 12. Honor your father and your mother, so that your days may be long in the land that the LORD your God is giving you. 13. You shall not murder. 14. You shall not commit adultery. 15. You shall not steal. 16. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. 17. You shall not covet your neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or male or female slave, or ox, or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.

Reader: A Reading from the Word of God written in Romans 7:13-25

13. Did what is good, then, bring death to me? By no means! It was sin, working death in me through what is good, in order that sin might be shown to be sin, and through the commandment might become sinful beyond measure. 14. For we know that the law is spiritual; but I am of the flesh, sold into slavery under sin. 15. I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate. 16. Now if I do what I do not want, I agree that the law is good. 17. But in fact it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me. 18. For I know that nothing good dwells within me, that is, in my flesh. I can will what is right, but I cannot do it. 19. For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I do. 20. Now if I do what I do not want, it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me. 21. So I find it to be a law that when I want to do what is good, evil lies close at hand. 22. For I delight in the law of God in my inmost self, 23. but I see in my members another law at war with the law of my mind, making me captive to the law of sin that dwells in my members. 24. Wretched man that I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death? 25. Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord! So then, with my mind I am a slave to the law of God, but with my flesh I am a slave to the law of sin.
