The Liturgy of the Word

The First LessonMr. Robert Bartlett

Reader : A Reading from the Word of God written in 2 Chronicles 36:14-23

14. All the leading priests and the people also were exceedingly unfaithful, following all the abominations of the nations; and they polluted the house of the LORD that he had consecrated in Jerusalem. 15. The Lord, the God of their ancestors, sent persistently to them by his messengers, because he had compassion on his people and on his dwelling place; 16. but they kept mocking the messengers of God, despising his words, and scoffing at his prophets, until the wrath of the Lord against his people became so great that there was no remedy. 17. Therefore he brought up against them the king of the Chaldeans, who killed their youths with the sword in the house of their sanctuary, and had no compassion on young man or young woman, the aged or the feeble; he gave them all into his hand. 18. All the vessels of the house of God, large and small, and the treasures of the house of the Lord, and the treasures of the king and of his officials, all these he brought to Babylon. 19. They burned the house of God,

broke down the wall of Jerusalem, burned all its palaces with fire, and destroyed all its precious vessels. ²⁰ He took into exile in Babylon those who had escaped from the sword, and they became servants to him and to his sons until the establishment of the kingdom of Persia, ²¹ to fulfill the word of the Lord by the mouth of Jeremiah, until the land had made up for its sabbaths. All the days that it lay desolate it kept sabbath, to fulfill seventy years. ²² In the first year of King Cyrus of Persia, in fulfillment of the word of the Lord spoken by Jeremiah, the Lord stirred up the spirit of King Cyrus of Persia so that he sent a herald throughout all his kingdom and also declared in a written edict: ²³ "Thus says King Cyrus of Persia: The Lord, the God of heaven, has given me all the kingdoms of the earth, and he has charged me to build him a house at Jerusalem, which is in Judah. Whoever is among you of all his people, may the LORD his God be with him! Let him go up."

Now there was a great deal of grass in the place; so they sat down, about five thousand in all. 11. Then Jesus took the loaves, and when he had given thanks, he distributed them to those who were seated; so also the fish, as much as they wanted. 12. When they were satisfied, he told his disciples, "Gather up the fragments left over, so that nothing may be lost." 13. So they gathered them up, and from the fragments of the five barley loaves, left by those who had eaten, they filled twelve baskets. 14. When the people saw the sign that he had done, they began to say, "This is indeed the prophet who is to come into the world." 15. When Jesus realized that they were about to come and take him by force to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain by himself.

LIVING AN ABUNDANT LIFE

“The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.” John 10:10

In the last few months, the news screaming at us was gloom and doom about the Bahamas and the wider world’s economy. Tourist arrivals falling, job layoffs, worst unemployment in fifteen years in the Bahamas. The world is in a recession, worse economic conditions since the Great Depression of the 1930s.

We are all feeling it in some way. From coping with the high cost of living, drowning in debt, struggling to make ends meet with reduced income, or at worst the loss of a job. Many of us are stressed out and emotionally depressed.

The economic recession is like the thief in John 10:10 robbing us of our joy and hope. The thief tries to tell us that life is filled with scarcity, worry, discouragement, and failure and turns us against each other, robbing us of a life of joy in Christ.

The wonderful reality is another news report is streaming at us. This news is about Jesus, the thief of abundance, that steals us away from this life and offers us the ability to live to the fullest, a life of meaning and joy culminating in our salvation.

Many economists say that the economic recession is caused in part by our psychological attitude. The more gloom and doom we are fed the more gloom and doom we will feel. Therefore, the first step we must take to transform our economy is to change our attitudes from scarcity to abundance. We must begin to believe that “In him we live and move and have our being” lies the answers to a life of true prosperity and abundance.

"Both abundance and lack exist simultaneously in our lives, as parallel realities. It is always our conscious choice which secret garden we will tend... when we choose not to focus on what is missing from our lives but are grateful for the abundance that’s present - - love, health, family, friends, work, the joys of nature and personal pursuits that bring us pleasure -- the wasteland of illusion falls away and we experience Heaven on earth." -- Sarah Ban Breathnach

Points I Want to Remember:
