Has any people ever heard the voice of a god speaking out of a fire, as you have heard, and lived? 34. Or has any god ever attempted to go and take a nation for himself from the midst of another nation, by trials, by signs and wonders, by war, by a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, and by terrifying displays of power, as the

LORD your God did for you in Egypt before your very eyes?
35. To you it was shown so that you would acknowledge that the LORD is God; there is no other besides him. 36. From heaven he made you hear his voice to discipline you. On earth he showed you his great fire, while you heard his words coming out of the fire. 37. And because he loved your ancestors, he chose their descendants after them. He brought you out of Egypt with his own presence, by his great power, 38. driving out before you nations greater and mightier than yourselves, to bring you in, giving you their land for a possession, as it is still today. 39. So acknowledge today and take to heart that the LORD is God in heaven above and on the earth beneath; there is no other. 40. Keep his statutes and his commandments, which I am commanding you today for your own well-being and that of your descendants after you, so that you may long remain in the land that the LORD your God is giving you for all time.
